#### SUFFOLK WINTER WARMTH PACKS ARE NOW AVAILABLE

#### The referral process is really simple!

Using our standard form please:

- Record your details.
- Record the client's details (so we can get their consent to

information being shared with us and contact them to arrange delivery).

- Either select a standard winter warmth pack on the form option A) or create a bespoke warmth pack by adding items (option B).
- If you cannot access the webform we can supply in alternative format to then email to:

winterwarmth@eastsuffolk.gov.uk requesting a copy.

We are limiting support initially to £65 per household but the webform provides a space to make the case for a more generous pack in particular cases. Please use it. We will come back to you if we need more information.

All referrals must be supported by an external statutory, voluntary or health agency.

You can also use the Suffolk Information Partnership system to refer. We will do the rest.

Most items will be posted direct from the company/companies we order from. On the form, please identify if the client may need help to install draught-proofing, light bulbs or similar and we'll organise that.



# JANUARY GARDENING

The festive season is behind us and although the days are slowly getting longer, they can still seem gloomy and dark. If your garden looks a bit neglected, grab your hat and gloves, it's time to head outside and beat the January blues!

The start of a new year has worked it's magic on my gardening enthusiasm, as it always does. The frenzy of Christmas is long forgotten and now my mind is buzzing with ideas for the garden this spring and summer. We may still be in the depths of winter but I do love to think ahead to warmer times!

One of the 'indoor' tasks I love to do as part of my planning, is to sort through the endless packets of seeds I seem to acquire. Check the dates on the packets, it is a bit of gamble sowing seeds that are old, they might or might not germinate well. To take the guesswork out of sowing old seed, do a simple viability test. It will tell you if the seed is worth sowing at all, and how much to sow. If only a small percentage of seeds germinate, you will need to sow a greater number to ensure a decent crop. All you need is some paper towel, an old plate and some cling film. Dampen the towel and place on a plate, then sow a thin row of seeds on the paper, you can sow multiple rows on one piece of paper if you keep the rows neat for identification. Cover the plate with cling film and keep in a warm light place. Make notes of the dates the seeds start to germinate. Most seeds will germinate within two weeks. After two weeks, count how many of the seeds have germinated, the lower the amount the more seeds you will need to sow to get a decent crop.

December was rather chilly (to say the least!) and with the cost of energy it's worth leaving your seed sowing a bit later this year, don't rush into it unless you can provide light and warmth to the seedlings. Later sowing's will soon catch up when the weather warms up.

Outdoors is still mostly about tidying. I didn't get round to all my autumn tidying, I had left it until we

closed the shop for our winter break and then the extreme cold weather hit early. One of my first tasks will be to mulch! I am a no dig gardener, so it is simply a case of removing any weeds that are hiding and putting the compost layer on the top. You can't do this when its frosty though because the soil will take longer to warm up in the spring. If I do decide to cut back the perennials, I will leave the cuttings in a heap so that any overwintering insects don't end up as compost! The blackbirds love throwing it all about to get at the insects, then I will have to get the broom out again but at least that is a task that keeps you warm!

Here are my other tips for January:

- Start cutting back deciduous grasses towards the end of the month
- Purchase and Chit Seed Potatoes
- Plant new soft fruit canes and bushes
- Winter prune wisteria and deciduous hedges such as hawthorn, beech or hornbeam
- Sow seeds of Summer bedding including Begonia, Lobelia, Salvia and Pelargonium in a heated greenhouse or propagator to provide early plants.
- Check your greenhouse plants for Botrytis (grey mould) and ventilate if necessary.

Whatever you decide to do in your garden in January, our shop will be open (weather depending!) and lovely new products will start arriving early in the month!

# Travel and Transport from early times - 18th and 19th Centuries (cont'd)

Reduced journey time due to better roads was militarily important in the Napoleonic Wars of 1803-1815, speeding up communications across the country and this, coupled with Royal Mail coaches, improved the delivery of mail. Amongst other things this led to the development of letterwriting between friends, families, and acquaintances. (This is of considerable importance to historians).

In Lakenheath most people got about in much the same way as they had since the middle-ages, usually on foot or by cart, by cadging a lift on a waggon with a carter. \*In 1853 JOHN HARDY and THOMAS SMITH were earning a living by 'carting' or 'hauling', going to Bury on Tuesdays and Saturdays. This way of getting about was common at least up to the First World War.



#### Hodskinson's Map of Suffolk 1783

This map of Suffolk is reliably detailed when compared with earlier maps. At the time of the survey roads were undrained and often deeply rutted by cart and coach wheels. At best, some received an occasional sprinkling of sand or gravel and in bad weather they could be passable only with discomfort and difficulty.

View looking down Broom Road.

This photo gives an idea of what a road could look like in the early 18th century. At the time of the photo Broom Road was a track leading from the gravel pits on the Warren.



In open country,

roads were not hedged or fenced, and deviations from routes when the surface became difficult were common. This could cause problems at night time or in stormy weather and such tracks may have been responsible for the \*death of Robert Eagle's postillion in 1829 whilst returning a horse in bad weather, hired maybe from the Bull Inn at Barton Mills or a hostelry in Mildenhall.

# The Lakenheath to Hockwold Road 1828

A road linking Lakenheath to Hockwold had become essential. For centuries the nearest bridge over the river had been at Brandon and there was a ferry at Wilton which is shown on Hodskinson's Map of 1783 as Ferry House. Parliament had been petitioned by local landowners and in 1828 Parliament gave its approval to the formation of The Lakenheath and Hockwold Roads Trust.

#### The Lakenheath and Hockwold Road Trust

The new roads were governed by \*Turnpike Trusts made up of influential landowners and justices of the peace initially appointed by Parliament who were required to 'make and maintain' the road by levying charges to users. The powers of the Trusts were closely defined by the Act.

\*It's been suggested that the name, 'turnpike', may originate in medieval times from guards armed with pikes whose weapons were turned away from the traveller when permission to pass was given.



Mr. Presland's coach shows the benefit of the improvement in road surfaces: lighter construction and faster transport. This coach was probably intended for local journeys.

Turnpike charges laid down by the Act:

'Horse or other Beast of Draught drawing any Description of Carriage. Sixpence.

For every beast not drawing a vehicle. Two pence.

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, Sheep or Lambs, etc. Eight pence per score.

Four wheeled Carriage not drawn by Horse or Beast of Draught but propelled by \*Machinery. **One shilling and Sixpence**.

Two-wheeled Carriage, not drawn by any Horse or Beast of Draught but propelled by Machinery. Nine pence.'

\*In 1803 A Road locomotive powered by steam was demonstrated in London by Trevithick and Vivian. The first electric carriage (car)

was built in London in 1884.

The toll charges covered 'return' journeys and no more than one charge per day was permitted. No more than two full tolls could be demanded on the same day for the passing and repassing of Cattle etc.

#### Further:

'Any Stage Coach, Diligence, Van, or Caravan or other Stage Carriage propelled by Machinery for pay or reward shall pay each time of passing.'

Those on foot had to pay One Penny to cross the river by the new bridge.
