
A Message from Lakenheath Parish Council Chair **Gerald Kelly**

What a time we're having! Everything from nuclear weapons to dog poo, with a few things in between...

I'll stick with those things the Parish Council and residents can at least try to do something about. The first of these are the closure of the Post Office and the withdrawal of the Mobile Bank. If we want to keep the Post Office there has to be something else which makes it a worthwhile business, so we are applying to have a Banking Hub. This is where there is a cash machine, and the big banks are represented for at least some of the week. That's definitely not the same as having a proper bank, but certainly worth trying for.

The Local Plan has been out for consultation. The main news here is that we have been allocated around eight hundred houses, although most of those we already knew about; but still no improvements to infrastructure or employment. This is primarily because Brandon isn't allowed any additional housing. So West Suffolk have set up what will be called the Brandon Commission to look at whether these restrictions are valid. both in terms of the law and Natural England's insistence that the Special Protection Area is actually the best way to protect the Stone Curlew. It's a huge issue, but that's it in a nutshell.

The litter pickers are still regularly out and about, and it's disheartening to see how much is collected each time. In amongst it is always a large number of dog poo bags which have been hung from trees or just dropped by the paths. Why I will never know, but please don't do it.



Information for you from

Suffolk County Council Councillor Row Heath Division Colin Noble

After a cold winter we can all look forward to the Spring months ahead.

Back in January and February, all our local councils, Parish, District and County, alongside the Police and Crime Commissioner, went through their budget-setting processes for the coming year.

For the County Council, the Council Tax is only a part of the money the council uses to deliver vital services such as supporting elderly and vulnerable adults and prospecting children alongside the more visible services like maintaining our roads.

A significant funding element comes from the Local Government settlement (the grant funding the government provides each council to run things like adult Social Care and Children's Services). This year's settlement is a cut in funding, so difficult decisions must be made. The County Council, like District and Parish Councils, cannot run a deficit and can only use reserves once. At the heart of this shortfall is an unprecedented increase in the need for our services that safeguard and care for Suffolk's most vulnerable residents. This year alone,

what we need to spend on Children's Services has increased by 28% and on Adult Services by 14%.

Some will have read that the council is stopping funding for the arts; this is not entirely true in that funding has been assured for the coming year but will stop in 2025/26. As much as many of us value the arts, as do I, supplementing them set against being able to provide child protection packages or helping the vulnerable get out of bed daily is not much of a decision.

Reluctantly, the county council element of the council tax bills will rise. But in all the meetings and discussions. I am mindful that your hard-earned money pays the council tax and that the bill must not increase a penny more than it must.

Sadly, at a full council meeting, an increase of just below 3% was agreed upon, alongside the social care precept of 2%, which will be contained in the Council Tax bills for the coming year.




Healing Waters and Tales from the River project lead tells us about a Lakenheath Walk in Spring

LAKENHEATH PARISH WALKS

akenheath is fortunate to have a good network of footpaths and the Parish Walk explores these every other Sunday afternoon, helping you to enjoy the beautiful area in which we live as well as keeping the footpaths open. Walking will give you a new perspective on life as well as the opportunity to make new friends. You are welcome to join us for a walk on a Sunday afternoon. We meet at Wings Road Car Park at 2 pm but don't expect anyone there before 1.55pm. Walks are about 5 miles long and take about 2 hours. If we see hares, deer etc we stop and watch them. Sturdy footwear, preferably boots, is essential. There is no charge and everyone is welcome.

Walks are planned for the following Sundays, 10 and 24 March, and every other Sunday thereafter. Dates are on the noticeboards at Wings Road Car Park, the Library and the Surgery. Or just turn up and, if we are not there, we should be there the following Sunday. We have had some problems with illness in recent months so if you came and found we were not there, please do not give up but try again.

FOOTPATH NEWS

I am not sure about the state of the footpaths as I have not been well enough to go on a walk. All the paths should have been cut in August so, if you go

walking and find a footpath is overgrown or impassible, it is important that you report it to Suffolk County Council. Hopefully then the County Council will take action to get it cut or take whatever remedial action is required. The next cut is due in May.

I do not know whether the remedial action has been taken on the path (Footpath 3) between Claypits Bridge on the Undley Road and the path from the Community Centre. The path was dangerous as the bushes had been allowed to grow up on top of the lode bank so you had to walk on the sloping side of the bank. Also at one point the lode bank had been dug out leaving a steep slope on loose soil near the lode. The Parish walk no longer uses this path which restricts the walks we can do. Work on this path has been outstanding for 2 years.

To report a footpath problem to the County Council, go on their website and select Roads and Transport, then Public Rights of Way in Suffolk, then Report a Public Right of Way Issue. You will then be able to open up the map and pinpoint the location and, on the left hand side of the map, select the type of problem and give details.

If we want the footpaths to be kept open, it is essential that problems are reported to the County Council.

At the Library

hanks to Jo Chambers our display in the library began in November, showing some of our work from the Parish Council website Heritage Pages.

For our first display we chose to feature Timeline 5, 1900 – 1939, and two stories, one featuring the remarkable villager, Henry Flatt, his WW1 experiences and later business activities, the other an account of village poverty and Liberal Party politics in the village in 1912-13. As I write both are still on display.

From time to time we will show different aspects of our work. In Spring we plan to feature Maidscross Hill, a place with deep roots in our village history.

On the website Heritage pages can be found:

- a large archive of early photographs of the village dating from the late 19th century.
- the village timeline with stories of the village researched from local and national sources.
- personal village memories from bygone years, and
- a downloadable Village Trail
 booklet. Two walks and information
 about areas of the village from the

This panel includes the Bell Hotel, Lakenheath Manor - 11th to 16th centuries, Churchgate Farm, The Merchant's House (site discovered by the Heritage Group), and the St. Mary's Wall Paintings Project which led to the recovery of its medieval wall paintings.

In the past we have been asked for printed versions of the Timeline and Stories but this has been beyond our resources. I'm pleased to say that it will soon be possible to request personal copies on payment of the normal photocopying charge. Please ask at the Library. You will also be able to read the stories in the library. As more become available we will produce a contents list.

New or reworked stories for Timelines 5 and 6 (1900 to 1948) available on the website now.

1927-1932 The Peace Movement in Lakenheath. (TL5). A reaction of villagers to the slaughter of WW1.

1937-1939 The Chivers Estate on Sedge Fen and the Refugees from the Nazis. (TL6). This is produced in collaboration with archivists from Suffolk Archives.

1947 The Lakenheath Floods and William Finlayson's story. (TL6). Now almost a forgotten episode in village history (before the Flood Relief Channel was created), William Finlayson's and other villagers' accounts make for sobering reading

BEFRIENDING CONNECT - SOCIAL GROUPS

he Voluntary Network has received funding as part of the wider SCC Public Mental Health programme to support, enable and strengthen the protective factors for good mental wellbeing. Befriending Connect is a 12-month project for the Brandon/Mildenhall area and will build on our well-established Befriending service.

We have been inspired by the Blue zone model, a study looking at areas of the world where people not only live long lives, but happy and healthy ones. The model highlights the importance of being able to 'Connect' and to have the 'Right Outlook' https://www.bluezones.com/2016/11/ power-9/

The idea for the project came from this along with an increasing number of requests from both existing and new clients to extend the befriending relationship beyond their homes. This highlighted the need for certain members of our community who although they have the mobility and means to access social groups in their area no longer have the confidence.

The main aim is to enable all members of our community to know how to connect. For some people they will simply need

to know what is out there and can do the rest themselves. To this end we will develop a webpage and social media posts to share comprehensive and current information about social groups and activities in the area.

For those individuals who require more support Befriending Connect will put in a Volunteer Connector to accompany the client to social groups for up to 4 weeks to enable the client to build relationships and confidence in that setting.

After the 4 weeks a review will be undertaken to ascertain if any additional support may be needed. We will be conducting wellbeing surveys at the beginning and end of the support and again later in the year to gather valuable findings about the impact of the project.

We are really excited to be piloting Befriending Connect in the Brandon/ Mildenhall area and look forward to working with you all on the project. For any questions or to discuss further please contact Caroline Robinson or Laura Cox-Watson.

"WHO IS THAT FIGURE ON A FLUORESCENT MOTORBIKE AND WHAT **ARE THEY DOING?"**

uring the day, local business owner, Tim Smith, can usually be found helping local companies with their fire safety. However, during the hours of darkness and on weekends and bank holidays, he can often be seen wearing his Hi-Vis safety gear, riding through the village on a motorbike with chequered fluorescent markings.

Tim is part of a team of volunteer riders for Norfolk Blood Bikes, that give up their own time transporting urgently required blood, plasma, samples and medical instruments between various hospitals and medical centres throughout the region.

At any time of the night (including days at weekends and bank holidays), Tim can receive a call letting him know that some of these products are needed to be collected without delay from the main blood bank at Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge and rushed to a patient in need at either Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Kings Lynn, the NNUH in Norwich, James Paget Hospital in Great Yarmouth or even further afield. Or, it could be that medical samples need to be picked up and taken immediately to a specialist analysis centre in London for rapid results, so that surgeons and Doctors can get the information they need to treat the patient correctly, thereby saving their life.

Norfolk Blood Bikes also run supplies back and forth for the East Anglian Air Ambulance to enable them to stay operational and ready to take to the skies at a moment's notice.

Furthermore, during the daytime on an ad-hoc basis, Tim and some of the volunteers offer to transport Donated Breast Milk from Donors to the Milk Hub in Norwich, to all of the neo-natal units that require supplies and to the Human Milk Foundation in Hertfordshire.

All of the Blood Bike riders are fully trained and hold an Advanced Rider qualification from RoSPA or the Institute of Advanced Motorists (IAM). This ensures that they possess a very high standard of vehicle control and thorough knowledge of the highway code; allowing them to get to their destination quickly whilst riding safely and effectively in all conditions.

Their work is all voluntary, and Norfolk Blood Bikes is funded by charitable giving alone. The goodwill of these people saves the NHS and the taxpayer a huge amount each year. Without them, these life-saving products may not reach the Doctors and surgeons treating your loved-one in time. Premature babies may not get the nourishing human milk required for early development and the bolstering of their immune system. Urgent samples (such as when Covid-19 first landed in the UK), might not have got to the test-laboratory in time to slow the spread of the virus and save many lives.

Whatever the weather: torrential rain. scorching sun, howling winds or even snow (they use cars in extremely cold weather), they are ready to go.

So, if you see Tim or any of his volunteer colleagues riding their Hi-Vis blood bikes, spare them a thought, give them a wave, and if safe to do so, let them pass whenever possible. One day it might be vou or vour loved one that need their precious cargo as quickly as possible!
