Gardening Tips for Winter

he last few weeks have been very wet and unusually for our sandy soil in places it's been too damp to work on as walking on it will compact the soil further. Short-lived flash floods after a downpour seldom harm most plants. It is prolonged, saturated soil that cause the most damage as the oxygen is used up by the plant roots and soil microorganisms. You can help your container plants by lifting them off the ground onto pot feet (or bricks) so that the drainage holes in the base are not blocked. This will also help stop your pots from cracking in frost.

To improve drainage on compacted lawns, spike or aerate the soil so that rainwater can flow down into the ground more easily, rather than puddling on the surface. You can use a garden fork to spike the lawn or a hollow-tined aeration tool, which removes plugs of soil. The holes should ideally be 10–15cm (4–6in) deep. For larger lawns, you can buy or hire a powered aerator. Brush a free-draining 'top dressing', such as horticultural sand, into the holes. Prolonged or repeated waterlogging of lawns can cause several issues:

- Bare patches finer grass species won't grow well in waterlogged soil and may eventually die. Coarser, more robust species or weeds may then take over.
- Algae, lichens and liverworts thrive in waterlogged conditions, affecting the appearance of the lawn, blocking light from reaching the grass and making the surface slippery.
- Moss will often colonise damp lawns, as well as shady areas and soil with a low pH (acidic). Although not usually welcome on fine lawns, moss can be an asset on less manicured lawns, greening up areas where grass fails to thrive and providing habitats for invertebrates.

If the excess water on your lawn is run-off from nearby hard surfaces, then adding a border known as a rain garden could help to absorb the water before it floods your lawn. A rain garden is planted with plants that can stand waterlogging for up to 48 hours at a time. The choice of plants will be governed by speed of drainage and a rain garden is not the same as a bog garden as it cannot guaranteed to be damp all year round. The following plants tolerate temporarily wet soil as well as dry:

Shrubs

Sambucus nigra cultivars Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire' Hydrangea 'Annabelle' Rosa rugosa

Herbaceous Perennials

Ajuga reptans
Campanula glomerata
Crocosmia 'Lucifer' AGM
Geranium 'Rozanne' AGM
Hemerocallis
Iris sibirica


Grasses

Calamagrostis brachytricha Deschampsia cespitosa Miscanthus sinensis cultivars

Avoid slippery paths by keeping your paths clear of fallen leaves and debris. Leaves that fall onto borders can generally be left where they are as the worms will soon drag them below soil and improve your soil structure. Good soil structure will hold moisture in dry weather and be free draining in flooding. Do keep the crowns of dormant perennials free from fallen leaves though as it can cause rotting, especially plants such as Hosta's.

Here's a couple of other tasks for December:

- Winter prune open grown Apple and Pear Trees. (not those grown against walls)
- Prune Japanese Maples (Acers) and grapevines if needed, as they will bleed sap if pruning is done any later.
- Apply glue bands to the trunks of fruit trees to prevent wingless female winter moths climbing the trunks and laying their eggs in the branches.
- Check your winter protection structures are securely in place, and if you have a greenhouse make sure the heater is working.



- Protect outdoor taps from frost by wrapping insulation around them.
- Clean and repair your garden tools. (or ask Santa very nicely for some new ones!)

WNAS November 2023

n Tuesday 7th November at the Mundford Bowls Club the WNAS were delighted to play host to Stewart Samuals: celebrity, historian and co-owner of Feltwell's prestigious familyrun, Wellington Inn.

For an equally prestigious airfield Stewart's introductory photograph did not pay tribute to its status. The main entrance to the site shows a rather grandiose brick monolith bearing the noble inscription: 'Liberty Wins'. Unfortunately, undergrowth has recently been given too much liberty.

Stewart soon reset the balance by revealing that everything else about the location could be described as treasure. The infrastructure is almost exactly as it was during WW2: hangers, workshops, schools and even a beautiful timber church built by Boulton and Paul. There is no living accommodation on the site but the houses are regularly maintained and original camouflage paintwork can still be discerned on the property walls. There are veterinary, dog training facilities and schools there. A testimony to this fact comes from WNAS member. Lee, who used to teach there. Stewart explained that RAF Feltwell has never been deactivated and a concrete runway was never built. It was designed as a satellite to Lakenheath in 1937. Before that there was a WW1 airfield between Feltwell and Hockwold; evidence of this can

be seen there today. The geography of the surrounding area seems to be ideally suited to the construction of airfields and it is not surprising that we see the 'golf balls' (radar surveillance scanners) there now. This scenario was a development of the Star wars initiative instigated by Ronald Reagan in the days of the Cold War. With radar and the atomic clock together with the Thor missile it would be possible to detect an adversary and counter attack with pin point accuracy. Feltwell was host to the first Thor missiles. They were originally of a German design. The British built the rockets and the Americans built the warheads. Ironically, the rockets were taken back to Vandenburg test site in California and were commissioned by RAF engineers from Feltwell.

Stewart intimated that there is now evidence of the construction of the first purpose built runway; a very short one. Can we see electric vertical take-off aircraft on the horizon?

Stop press: at an affectionate level Stewart made mention of the bond we have with America. Every day on the base at 4-30pm the National Anthem is broadcast followed by the Star Spangled Banner, At Halloween. children head for the officer's quarters first where the pickings are more juicy. RAF Watton is not the only base to host its own wartime ghost.



What Winter Brings to RSPB Lakenheath Fen

he habitats here create an ideal refuge for birds travelling here from their breeding grounds in more northerly places. The largest of these is the Whooper swan - which may be well-known to you if vou're a wildlife lover as they can be seen gathered in stubble fields from November onwards in our local area. Here thev'll feed on spilt maize, potatoes and grain crops, and will look to roost in large areas of open water. The Hockwold Washes (adjacent to Lakenheath Fen) is a popular roosting site where numbers can build to 10,000+ but they can vary from one night to the next. On clear nights with good visibility or a full moon, Whoopers will sometimes stay out all night feeding, if they can see well enough, and won't bother to come to roost. However, if we get a foggy day or a very wet start, they'll stay on the Washes after dawn and more visitors have a chance of seeing them before they leave for the day.

If you'd like to see the swans try getting here around dusk or early in the day - before dawn - and you stand a good chance. Their beautiful honking calls are a delight to hear and you may even see a few of the rarer. much smaller Bewick's swan too. These breed even further north than Whoopers, just west of the Ural Mountains in Arctic Russia. Bewick's also wait for longer before they move to the UK for winter, and we don't often see any before Christmas. Because they are smaller and there's fewer of them, they do tend to segregate themselves away from the Whoopers on the Hockwold Washes to avoid conflict with the bigger swans.

A whole range of smaller birds visit us for the winter - Redwing, Fieldfare, Siskin, Lesser redpoll, and Marsh tit. The first two - Redwing and Fieldfare can be spotted on the reserve throughout winter, feeding on berry bushes, digging for worms and bugs in waterlogged fields, and in mixed flocks with Blackbirds. Song thrushes and Mistle thrushes feeding in

fields in rolling groups that can be fascinating to watch. If we get a frosty spell where the ground is frozen, the paddock in Brandon Fen (near the car park) can be a great place to look. We have a footpath around the perimeter and a couple of benches to rest a while too!

Back at the Visitor Centre, we have some bird feeders which attract a few species that we don't tend to see in the warmer months especially Marsh tit.

Our car park is an unlikely location for Brambling, which is a stunning finch that is very closely related to the more familiar Chaffinch.

A walk around the nature reserve on a clear and frosty day will reward you with some stunning views - as all of the vegetation is etched in frost, including the seedheads of the reeds that make up vast patches of the reserve. With a clear blue sky above, the reserve just shines and glitters like a scene from Narnia.

We'll have hot and cold drinks and a selection of snacks available at the Visitor Centre every day, with a break at Christmas, Our Visitor Centre and toilets are open daily from 9am to 4pm during the winter, switching to a 5pm closure when the clocks go forward on 31 March 2024.
